

In the past few years the city of Bydgoszcz has become a very important place on the map of Poland, Central and Eastern Europe as a centre for both domestic and foreign ITO companies.

The city is now more frequently associated with the outsourcing sector. Colliers International recognised the value of dynamic development of the market, its great potential and high quality of services. In their report "Improving through moving", Colliers International awarded Bydgoszcz with the title of "BPO Rising Star".

Bydgoszcz enables companies from ITO sector to create competitive advantage based not only on economic aspects such as costs, but also on the quality of services. The city offers attractive conditions for conducting business, local developers offer modern office spaces of the highest standard and, most importantly, skills of local IT specialists remain at a highest level providing a continuous supply of talents to the labour market.

The ITO sector is now one the most dynamic sectors in Bydgoszcz. What is more, employment in IT industry has increased by 110% in the years 2010 – 2013.

Taking into account the above, Bydgoszcz may apply for the title of the Polish "IT Centre of Excellence".

The potential of local IT specialists has been recognised by new investors who launched their operations in Bydgoszcz, as well as by companies that already operate in the city and are now further expanding their activity. These companies include Atos IT Service, Alcatel – Lucent Technologis, SDL, Mobica, Genesys, ASSECO Systems, Sunrise System, Bazy i Systemy Bankowe, TEL-DAT, Livingston International, PZU and Grupa Banku Pocztowego.

Potential investors value the fact that Bydgoszcz is the largest city in the Voivodeship, the eighth

largest in Poland with over 360 000 inhabitants and 1 million population within the distance of 50km. Bydgoszcz has an International Airport which is constantly expanding flight connections and the average age of the young and enterprising people does not exceed 36.

The employees of ITO companies mainly consists of students and graduates of local universities which include, among others, a prestigious J. and J. Śniadeccy University of Technology and Life Sciences, The Kazimierz Wielki University and several renowned universities, colleges and academies (15 in total). 
